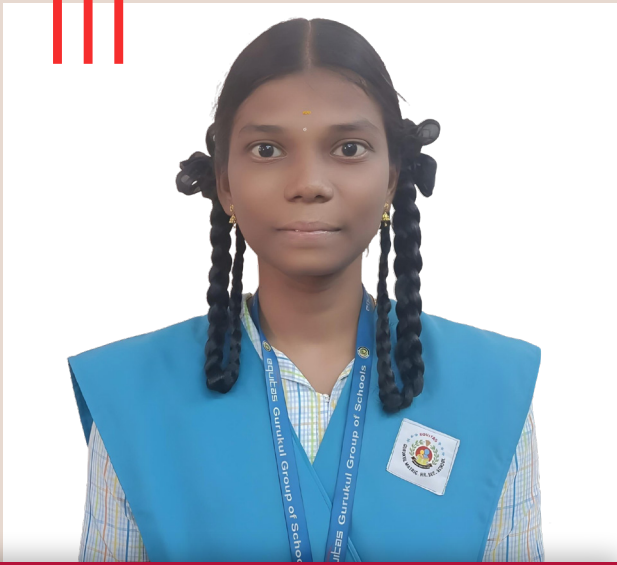

Helping Shanmuga Priya Continue her Education

“The scholarship I received from Equitas has been a godsend, helping me continue my education and reducing my family’s financial pressure.”

Shanmuga Priya lost her father at the tender age of two. Her younger sister was intellectually disabled and required special care and attention. With two young daughters needing care and education, the responsibility to provide for them fell on their mother.

Despite the challenges, her mother was resolute about education and enrolled Shanmuga Priya at the Equitas Gurukul School in Karur. At the start of each academic year, she would take a loan just to pay the school fees. She worked tirelessly, stitching clothes at home to feed her children, and repaid the loans with the meagre income she earned.

However, this did not last long. Due to increasing financial pressure, they were unable to pay the school fees and Shanmuga Priya was almost forced to drop out of school.

Realizing the struggles of Shanmuga Priya’s family, Equitas Gurukul School offered her the Equitas Vidhya Fund scholarship.

“The scholarship I received from Equitas has been a godsend, helping me to continue my

education and reducing my family’s financial pressure,” says Shanmuga Priya.

The Equitas Vidhya Fund is given to female students, who are raised by single parents and/or are physically challenged, on the recommendation of the school’s Principal.

Shanmuga Priya has been a recipient of this fund for three consecutive years. She is currently in Grade XII and is looking forward to becoming a college student!

Fighting Cancer with Courage: Sheela's Story of Survival

Cancer is a word that causes dread in every person awaiting test results. Sadly, this was a reality for Sheela.

Suresh and his family are residents of Chennai, Tamil Nadu. About a year ago, his mother Sheela was diagnosed with Ovarian Cancer!

They immediately admitted her to the Sringeri Sharada Equitas Hospital in Gowriwakkam, Chennai, which specialises in providing quality cancer care at low costs.

"In one of the most frightening times of her life, the nurses and staff gave her the support and courage she needed to face surgery," says Suresh.

What was initially supposed to be a ten-hour surgery, stretched into an agonizing seventeen hours.

"For those 17 hours, the surgeon put his heart and soul into completing the surgery successfully."

"Without an iota of doubt, Dr. Naveen Padmanabhan was like an embodiment of God to us at that crucial time.

A special mention to the anaesthesiologist Dr. Jothi Murugan, who stood as a pillar of support to the surgery procedures," shares Mr. Suresh.

"The post-operative procedures and care were par-excellence. The chief physiotherapist Mr. S. Naveen Kumar made sure my mom stood up on the very second

day after surgery! We are very grateful to him." He also shares his experiences with the administration. "Mr. Suriya made sure that processing our cashless insurance claims was smooth and seamless. The entire claim settlement process was completed without any stress for us."

The Struggle of 3 Women for Dignity, Identity and a Home

“We never had an identity or proof, but now we have all the proof we need. We’re very happy, Sir,” says Pushpa.

Pushpa, Sivagami, and Lalitha used to live on the pavement with their families in Chennai. Making ends meet while trying to protect and provide for their children was a challenge day in and day out. They worked odd jobs and supported their family with the little wage they earned.

In a desperate attempt to provide their children with shelter, they approached multiple house owners in search of a rented house. But they were turned down every time for the sole reason that they were pavement dwellers.

“They said that they won’t give us houses because we came from the pavements,” says Pushpa.

“There is nothing that stops them from giving us a house just because we’re from the pavement. We’re humans too, aren’t we?” asks Sivagami, highlighting the gross injustice and discrimination shown towards people like them. people like them.

The Equitas Birds Nest Program helped find homes for Pushpa, Sivagami, Lalitha and their families in Perambur, Chennai.

“We never had an identity or proof. But now we have all the proof we need. We’re very happy, Sir,” says Pushpa.

Today, Pushpa sends her children to the Ayanavaram Government School, ensuring they get a good education.

Aspiring to become a doctor and engineer, they are on their way to achieving their dreams! We have continued staying in touch with her, making sure her family has stable housing.

Now, she has saved enough money and has bought her own home!

At Equitas, these are the kind of relationships we have with the people and families we help.
